# **Maths**

- Maths is taught in 2 groups across year 3. Both groups will cover the same objectives: the autumn term focus will be on place value/4 operations and fractions. Homework will mainly be times tables with some 4 calculations work. Knowing times table facts up to 12x12 is essential.
