In summary to analyse a text in detail.




Maths


- Maths: Is taught in 2 groups across Year 6. All groups cover the same content: the Autumn Term focus will be on Place Value/4 Operations and Fractions. Arithmetic will be included in the extended daily session and homework will be a mixture of calculation, problem solving, speed tables and arithmetic.
- <u>Reminder</u>: All children are subscribed to Abacus online so please encourage them to use it!
 Passwords and Usernames have been distributed.

English

• English: Taught in own classes. Our genres for this term are: newspaper reports, narrative, diaries, stories with flashbacks. SPaG (Spelling/punctuation/ grammar) will be taught in an explicit lesson as well as included in writing sessions. Five Guided Reading sessions per week. Spelling lessons are taught weekly. The year 5/6 statutory spelling list can be found in the back of the pupil planner. If you are able to give up any spare time to hear the children read, then please let us know as offers will be gratefully received.

PSHE & RE

• RE & PSHE: 'How Do Christians Worship God?' is the question asked in RE this term while in PSHE we will be looking at NEW Beginnings and setting goals for the year ahead and encouraging Growth Mindset along with Personal safety and E-Safety.



Foundation Subjects

Topic: World War II inc. The Blitz & Evacuees. If you have any related artefacts or resources that the children could share in class we would be very grateful. This includes relatives who may be willing to discuss their own experiences with the children.

Art & DT: Art focuses on a range of drawing and painting techniques linked in with our WW2 topic. In DT lessons children will be making their own Marionette puppet.

Computing: Children will be working in pairs to create a radio broadcast from The Blitz using their writing in English and learning how to record and sound using the Audacity program.



PE: Invasion Games & Dance: taught by specialist Sports Coaches and class teachers. Named PE Kit should be in school Monday to Friday. Plimsolls for indoor PE sessions and trainers for outdoor are expected. Navy tracksuits are allowed in colder months. Watches and earrings must be removed by the children for PE lessons.

Homework

Children are expected to read 5x per week for 25 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult.

Homework for Maths and English are given out on a Monday, with the English due Wednesday and Maths Thursday.

Spelling lists are set weekly.

Homework should take no longer than 40 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue.

On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be given as well as Spellodrome or online tasks. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible.

Homework club is on Monday for children that need more support.

Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner:

Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in one small pencil case. An art shirt is required. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small stud earrings can be worn. Long hair is tied back. No nail polish. Uniform must be clearly named and worn correctly. Homework Planners are to be in school daily.

School shop is open on Fridays.

Inhalers must be in school daily and any medicine given to office.



Class teacher is the first point of contact.

Planners are checked daily and children are asked if there are any notes. Emails are checked when able, so if a matter is urgent please telephone and leave a message.
