The applicant must be able:

- To implement effective behaviour management strategies in and out of the classroom

- To work closely with colleagues, as often as is appropriate, to plan, deliver and evaluate music lessons and activities which link with other topics being studied by pupils.

- To contribute to the wider life of Oakfield School. e.g. music clubs concerts
