

English: Taught in classes.

Genres for this term are: Adventure & mystery stories (Flat Stanley & Mungo and the Pirates picture book) & Information Texts.

SPAG (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) lessons are taught weekly.

Guided Reading sessions are held daily and regular parent volunteers are most welcome!

There is a weekly spelling lesson and handwriting lesson.

Reading - our reading scheme is extensive and is intended to run into years 5 / 6.

Topic:

Why are jungles so wet and deserts so dry? - climate zones, land use, human and physical features, longitude and latitude, using globes and atlases, ... and much more

PSHE - 'Relationships', 'Changing Me' & Pedestrian Training

RE: How did the church begin? Why do Christians share communion? How did Jesus change lives?

Homework:

- We encourage children to read for around 10-15 mins a day, recorded in their planner
- 1 x English/Maths per week
- Homework should take approx. 20 minutes or longer if children are happy to continue
- Children are given a minimum of 2 school nights to complete homework tasks.
- Planners should be signed weekly
- Homework planners should be in school every day and signed weekly
- Spelling Homework
- **We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible.**

Maths

Classes will cover the following: numbers and the number system, calculations, solving problems, handling data, measures, shape and space.

Learning times tables is a key homework focus in year 3.
