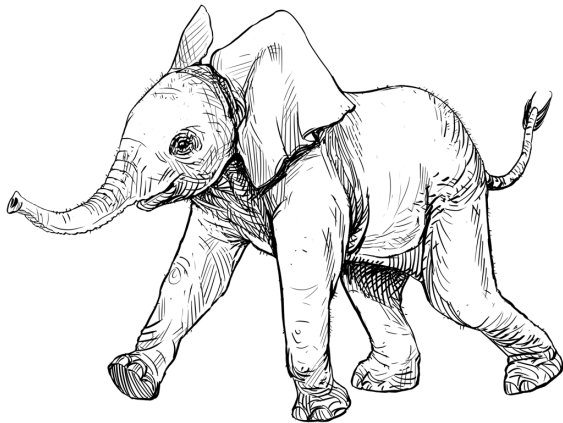


Elephant

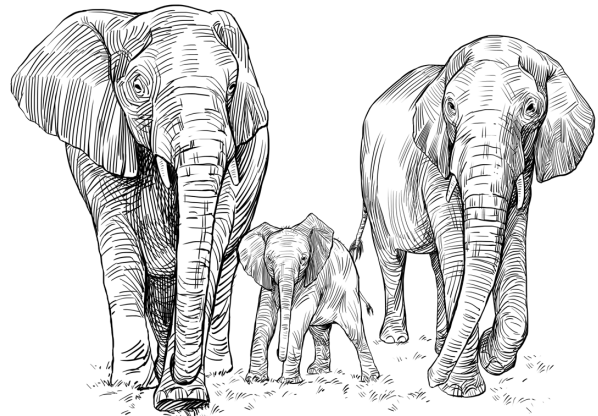


Newly born

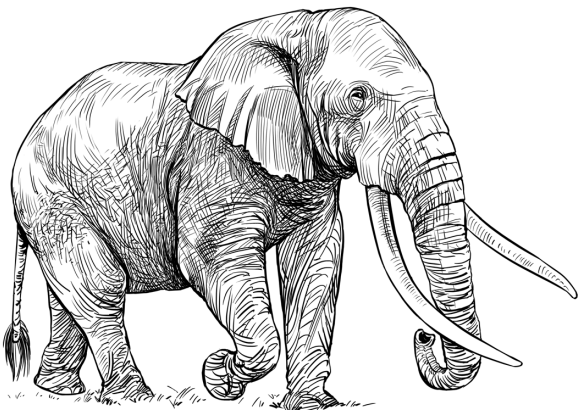
Young calf

Death of an old elephant, mourned by the herd.

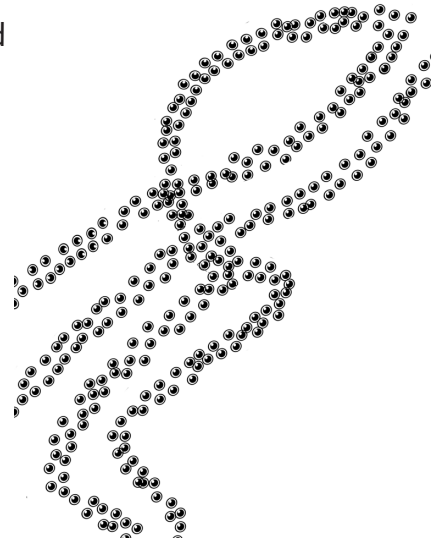

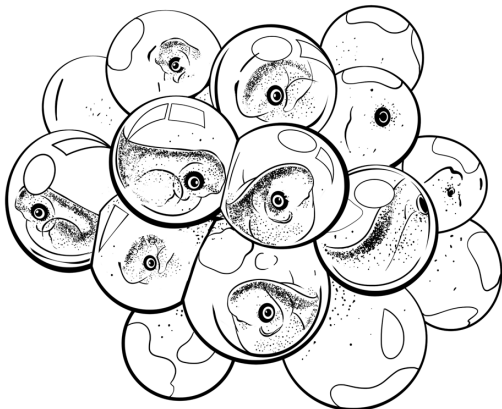


Toad

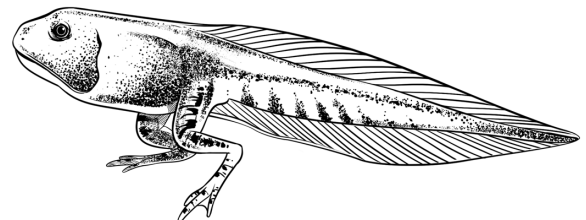
Eggs laid
in strips



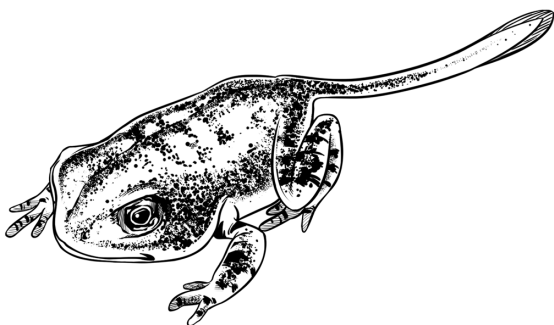
First signs of tadpole
growth inside egg



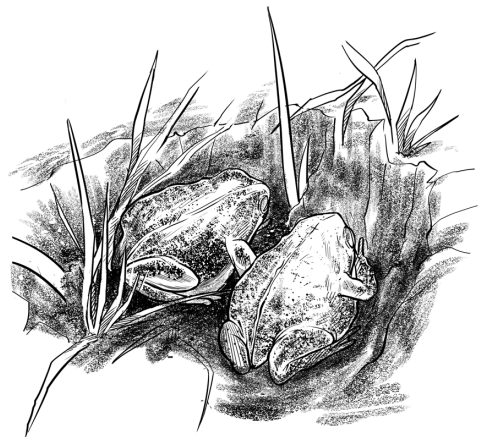
Tadpoles begin to

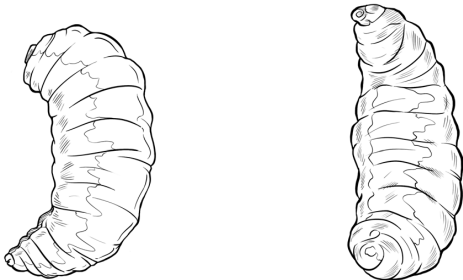


Bumble bee

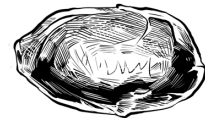
Eggs

Adults hatch. It may be a worker (female), who stays in the nest or a male or female with the potential to reproduce.



Mature adults mostly die at the end of season – new queens hibernate underground over the winter, ready for the next year.

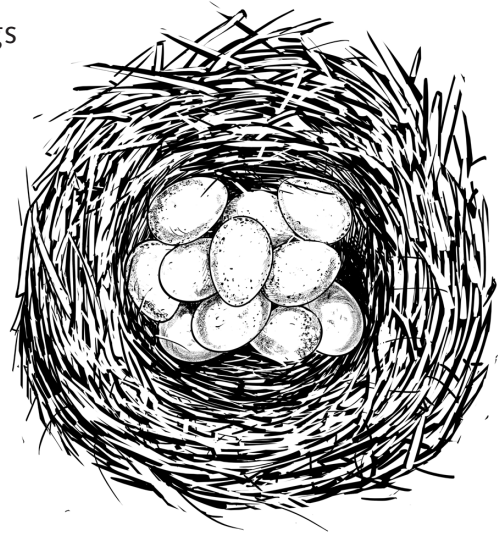

Blue tit

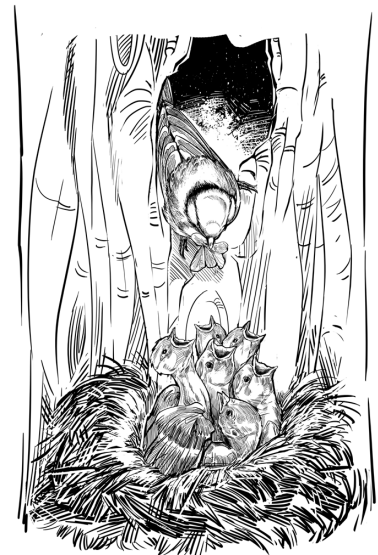
Eggs

Young birds are still fed by adults for a while.



Adult bird. Begins to reproduce in following year.



Most mature adults die after several years, depending on food supply and weather conditions.
