
Snowdonia

Snowdonia is in north-western Wales. It covers 823 square miles. It is the largest National Park in Wales. It was first to be designated of the three National Parks in Wales. It contains the highest peaks in UK outside of Scotland.

How big is Snowdonia

Snowdonia is 2132 km squared. One of Snowdonia's 15 peaks is Mount Snowdon, it's the tallest one. It would take approximately 6 hours to walk up and down; depending on the path you take you could be walking 7 to 10 miles. Mount Snowdon's elevation is 1085 metres and its prominence is 1038 metres.

When did Snowdonia become a National Park.

Snowdonia National Park was established in 1951 as the third national park in Britain, following the Peak District and the Lake District. It was also the first Welsh National Park out of the three parks which included Pembrokeshire Coast and Brecon Beacons.


Why is Snowdonia a National Park
