ABOUT THE WONDERFUL PLACE

The National Park in Scotland has:

- 1,865 squared km's
- A boundary length of 350km
- 21 Munros
(Scottish mountain) with a height
of more than 3000ft
- Ben Moore, a mountain of
1,174m, which is the tallest
mountain there

Also the national park is the fourth
largest in the UK.

- 50% of Scotland's population lives within an hour of the park

- Woodpeckers
- Red Squirrels
- Dolphins
- Whales

- The Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park became fully operational on 19 July 2002 and was officially opened by Princess Anne on 24 July 2002.
