

<p>English: Taught in own classes. Our genres for this term are: Dramatic conventions, Poetry and Persuasion. SPaG (Spelling/punctuation/grammar) will be taught in an explicit lesson as well as included in writing sessions. Five Guided Reading whole class sessions per week. In addition to this, a daily whole class reading for enjoyment session and book study. Spelling lessons are taught weekly. Most tasks will be set online. Reminder: All children are subscribed to Abacus, TTRockstar and Doodle Maths online so please encourage them to use it! <p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5 x per week for 25 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for English will be set on a Thursday, and is to be completed by Tuesday. Maths will be set on a Monday and completed is to be completed by Wednesday. Spelling lists are also set. Each task should take no longer than 25-30 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, Science, Topic or Art homework may be set as well as other tasks. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible; Homework club takes place on Monday lunchtimes in 5MG for those pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which can connect to the internet.</p>		<p>Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner: Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, green pen, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in one small pencil case in school. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small plain stud earrings may be worn. Long hair is tied back with a plain small band and correct socks should be worn. No nail polish.
