SPaG (spelling/punctuation/ grammar) will be taught in explicit lessons as well as included in writing sessions. Five whole class reading sessions per week. In addition to this a daily whole class novel will be shared with the class. Spelling lessons are taught 3 times a week. In DT lessons children will be making their own Marionette puppet.</p>
<p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5x per week for 30 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English is set on a Monday, with the English due Wednesday and Maths Thursday. Spelling lists are set weekly. Each task should take no longer than 30-35 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be set or additional handwriting activities for those who need it. Homework club will take place on Monday after school for those pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which is connected to the internet on which to complete their homework.</p>		<p>Computing: Children will create a radio broadcast from The Blitz using their writing in English and learning how to record and manipulate sound using the Audacity program. E-safety lessons covers responsible usage.</p>
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
