<p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5x per week for 20 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English are set on a Monday and should be completed by Thursday. Spelling lists are set weekly. Each task should take no longer than 20 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be set. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible. Homework club will take place weekly for pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which is connected to the internet on which to complete their homework.</p>		<p>Computing: Our topics this term: using presentation software packages and using algorithms to code a program on Scratch; E-Safety (responsible usage) is regularly taught.</p>
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
