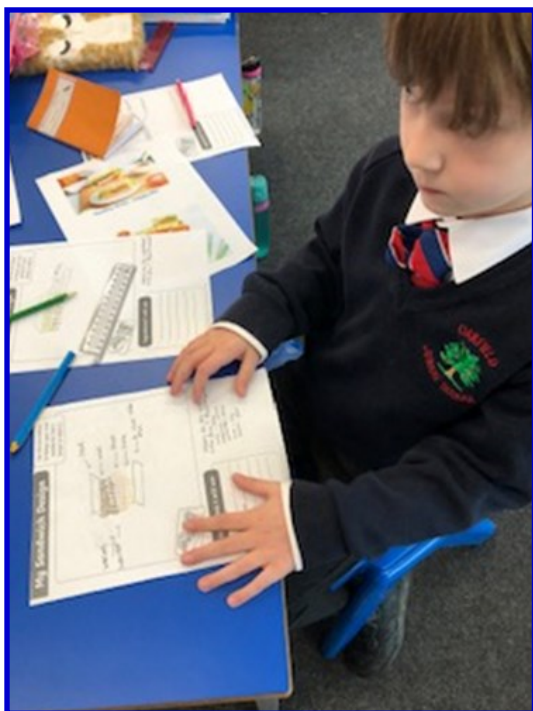

Year 3 had a visit from a nutritionist who told us about eating the rainbow to help us to eat healthily. We then used the information to design a healthy sandwich.

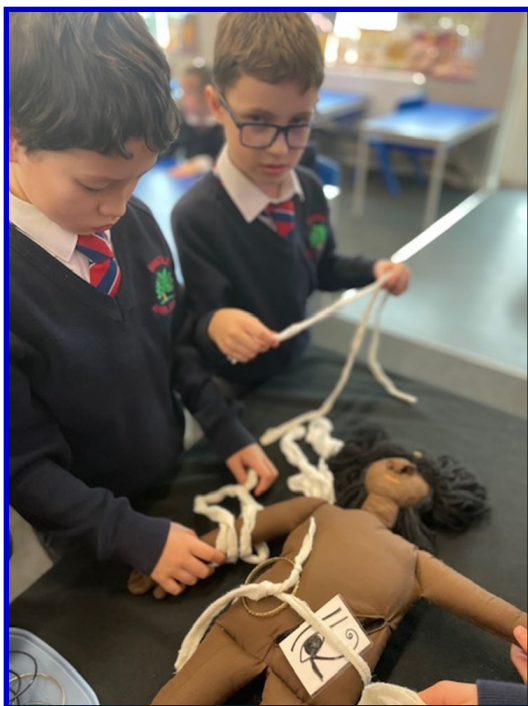


YEAR 3

EGYPTIAN WORKSHOP DAY

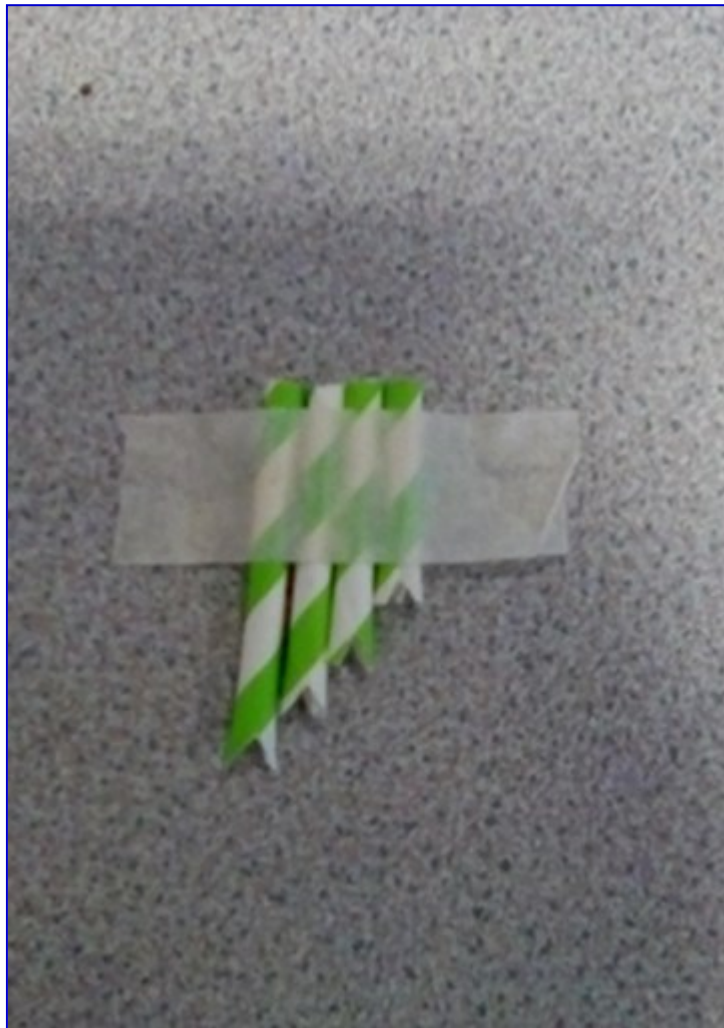

JUNIOR CITIZEN EVENT

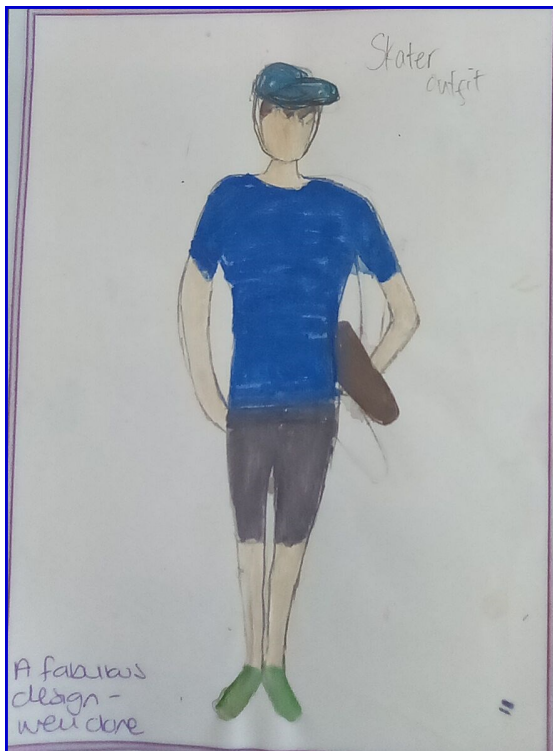
These are photos from the first aid workshop. The children learned how to put an injured person into the recovery position.

Breathwork Techniques

Breathwork has been used for centuries to promote good wellbeing. When you feel stressed, your breath tends to become fast and shallow. This limits the oxygen entering your bloodstream. Your brain tells your body that there is a threat, and your body responds in fight or flight. Focusing on longer out-breaths than in-breaths can combat this by engaging the parasympathetic nervous system.

1

TEDDY BEAR BREATHING

Lie on your back, place a hand on your chest, and place a teddy bear on your belly button. Close your eyes and relax your entire body. Breathe in slowly through the nose. The teddy bear should rise, but your chest should not.

2

4-7-8 BREATHING

Completely exhale through your mouth, making a "whoosh" sound. Close your mouth and inhale quietly through your nose as you mentally count to four. Hold your breath for a count of seven. Exhale completely through your mouth, making another "whoosh" sound to a count of eight.

3

LION'S BREATH

Inhale deeply through your nose for a few counts. "As you exhale, breathe out through your mouth, sticking out your tongue and making a 'haaaa' sound.

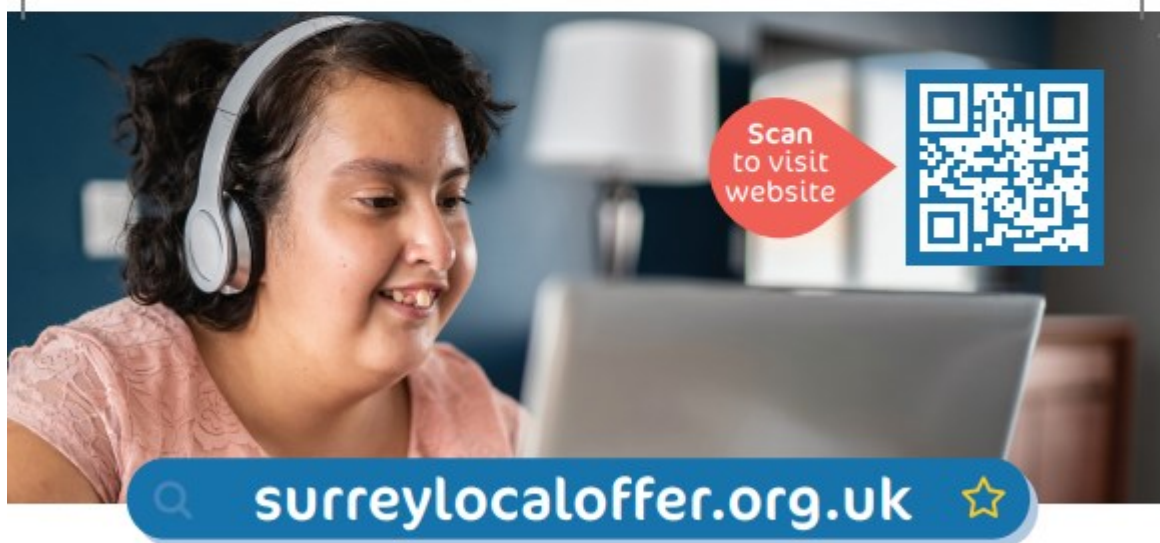

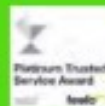
