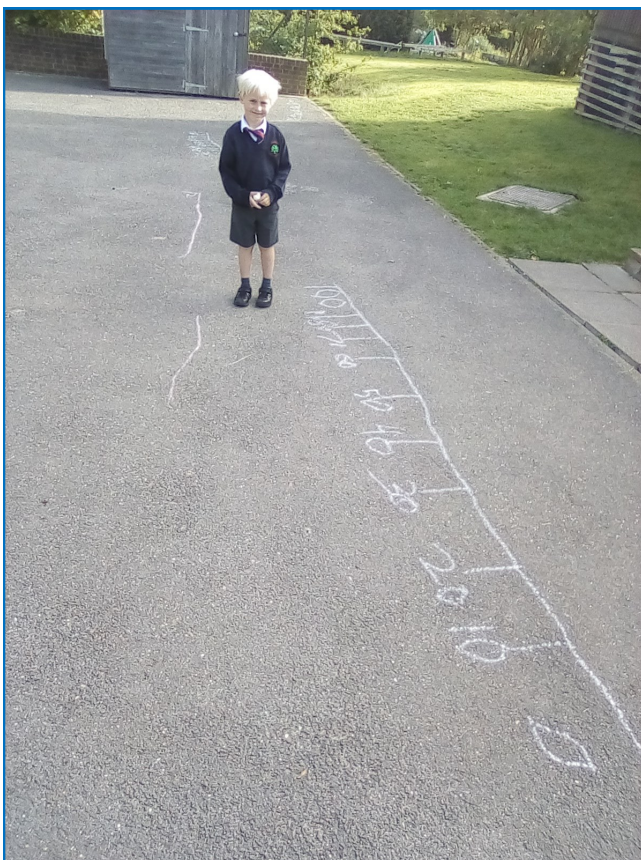



Selective breeding is when humans interfere with the natural breeding process of living things. There are **advantages** and **disadvantages** of this which I will discuss below.

Domestic animals (pets)





Firstly, let's talk about domestic animals such as dogs. A pug has some advantages and disadvantages, the advantages are they are good companions, playful and friendly, however, the disadvantages are that their faces are flat so they have breathing problems, they also can get injections in their skin.



Livestock (Farm animals)

Now let's jump into livestock, first we will talk about cows. The advantages of a cow is that the more muscle the more meat and the more money, people breed cows with muscle until they get the perfect

cow, they also do this with cows that have lots of milk. Now, we will look at the disadvantages of a cow, i.e. a cow has too much weight it will be too heavy and the joints in their legs may break and they live an unhappy life. We will discuss chickens now. Chickens can produce eggs and chicken which we can eat when cooked, but some disadvantages are that when they are in cages they're not happy and if they're not happy they won't lay eggs and farmers won't make money.

Domestic Animals

First, let's look at the advantages of selective breeding. Many people breed dogs so they can be used to help blind people or sniff out drugs or bombs. The disadvantages are that dogs, for example, have problems with their breathing because of their squished faces. Or they might be bred more so a dog might have a short life span and not be immune to diseases.








Livestock (farm animals)

The advantages of selective breeding for farm animals are that you will get better sheep, chickens that lay eggs. These are the best parts about selective breeding. The disadvantages are that if you make a sheep too heavy, it may be too heavy for its legs, the chickens may also be very unhappy as they don't have a big space to roam around and if they're not happy that's not healthy and if they're not healthy they won't lay eggs.

Cultivating crops/plants

The advantages of breeding crops is that the plants will look nicer so they will sell more and make more money. The plants might even grow quicker so they can get in shops quicker. The disadvantages are that if you like plants you can't eat the shoots and leaves are thrown out and wasted. They also might get pesticides so they are bad to eat.

Conclusion Is selective breeding ethical?

In conclusion, I think selective breeding has advantages and disadvantages. The advantages are it can help people who need it, like blind or disabled people. You can also have police dogs that can sniff out drugs or stolen money. The disadvantages are that you might accidentally breed the wrong dog and it will have issues. Therefore, I think selective breeding is ethical if done correctly.

Domestic animals

First things first, there are good and bad things about domesticated breeding. Here are some examples on the advantages to this. Police dogs have amazing senses of smell and sound which they have been bred for. Guide dogs have also been bred for patience and to help blind. Now let's talk disadvantages like pugs for example who's faces are always in pain and often get injections.



Livestock farm animals

If you read the last paragraph you should know what we're talking about, now let's discuss farm breeding with cows. Breeding the right cows makes the next year, muscular or fat if they're muscular they will be worth more. Let's talk disadvantages. Deep and cows legs hurt if they become muscular and chickens often are cramped up in small pens.



Cultivating plants/crops

The advantages of selectively breeding plants are that it makes them small, nice, and look more attractive. The effect that it has on some plants is that they become more juicy. The bad things are that they can get pesticides too readily and get thrown away.



Conclusion: is selective breeding ethical?

In conclusion, I think selective breeding is bad because they can go horribly wrong and extremely painful, like what humans do to cows by making them have sex without wanting to. Or what can happen to plants they can go mouldy or get pesticides.

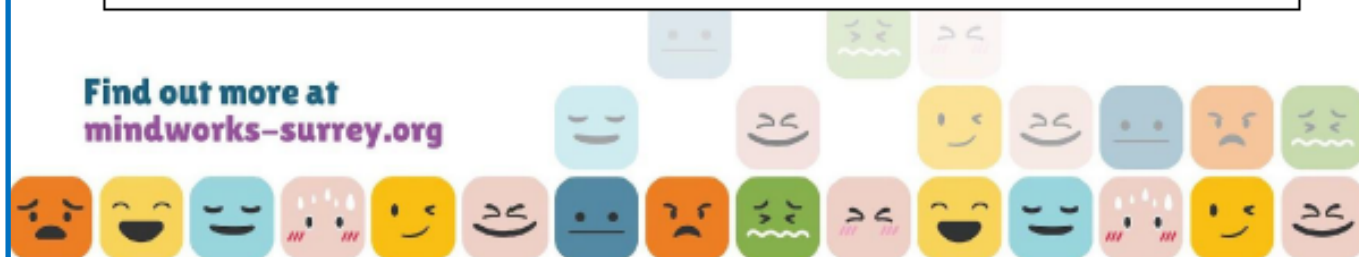

Year 5 STEM Event: Mission Discovery

We are excited to invite your child to take part in a special STEM event during the October Half Term on **Tuesday 28 October at Manor House School**, from **9.00 am to 12.00 pm**. This will be open to children in Year 5 from Manor House School, Cranmore, St Teresa's and other local schools.

The event, themed "STEM Stars: Mission Discovery", promises to be a fun and inspiring morning filled with hands-on science, technology, engineering and mathematics activities. Pupils will work collaboratively to solve problems, explore new ideas and ignite their curiosity about the world beyond our own!

During the session, the children will rotate through three exciting challenges:

- Alien Substance Investigation - become scientists and analyse mysterious materials from outer space
- Code the Rover - try their hand at programming and guiding a Mars rover across a planetary surface.
- Crack the Cosmic Code - use logical thinking and teamwork to decode messages from another galaxy.

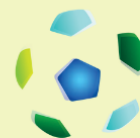
