






<p><b>English:</b> Taught in own classes. The texts we are studying are 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and 'Eye of the Wolf' where we will be writing the following: A flashback story, A Ship's Log, A letter and a persuasive argument. SPaG (Spelling/Punctuation/ Grammar) will be taught in an explicit lesson as well as included in writing sessions. Five Guided Reading sessions per week. Spelling lessons are taught 3x weekly. All groups cover the same content: The Spring Term focus will be ratio, measures, algebra, statistics and shape with regular revision of arithmetic (calculation &amp; fractions). Homework will be linked to classwork or revision of previous work. <b>Reminder:</b> All children are subscribed to Doodle online and TT Rockstars, so please encourage them to use these resources! Passwords and Usernames have been distributed.</p>

<p><b>Homework:</b> Children are expected to read 5x per week for 30 mins. This should be recorded in their Homework Planner and signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for Maths and English is set on a Friday, to be completed by the following Friday. Spelling lists are set weekly and tested every Friday. Each task should take no longer than 30-35 minutes or longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, science, topic or art homework may be set or additional handwriting activities for those who need it. Homework club will take place weekly on a Thursday lunchtime for those pupils who do not have access to an electrical device which is connected to the internet on which to complete their homework or require additional support. Homework is posted on Google Classroom every Friday, as well as written in planners.</p>	<p><b>Essentials/Daily Kit/Planner:</b> Your child needs a pencil, rubber, sharpener, 30cm ruler, green pen, coloured pencils, whiteboard pen, glue stick and blue handwriting pen, kept in <b>one small pencil case</b>. Children are encouraged to wear watches. Only small plain stud earrings may be worn. Long hair is tied back with a <b>plain small band and correct socks should be worn</b>. No nail polish or nail extensions. Uniform must be clearly named and worn correctly. Homework Planners are to be in school daily.
