SPaG (Spelling/Punctuation/Grammar) is taught as an explicit lesson and included in writing sessions. Four guided reading sessions per week. Spelling lessons are taught weekly. The year 5/6 statutory spelling list can be found in the back of the pupil planner. Spelling tests are held weekly on a Thursday. This links with the SRE education covered during the second ½ term. The Summer Term focus will be on Place Value/4 Operations, Fractions, Decimals and knowing, using number facts, measurements and properties of shape. <p>Homework: Children are expected to read 5 x per week for 25 minutes. They should record this in their Homework Planner and have it signed weekly by a parent/adult. Homework for English and maths homework will be set on a Monday (available on Google classroom on Friday) and is to be completed by Thursday. Spelling lists are also set. Each task should take no longer than 25-30 minutes, longer if a child is happy to continue. On occasion, Science, Topic or Art homework may be set as well as other tasks. We encourage parents to support their child with their learning as much as possible; Homework club takes place weekly on a Thursday lunchtime in 5 Alder Class for those pupils who do not have access to an electrical device, which can connect to the internet.
