

The children in Year 6 took the National Curriculum tests in May. The table below compares the results last term with those from the previous two years. The Government's expectation (and indeed ours!) is that all children will reach at least Level 4. Remember that we have a Special Needs Centre and even though these children have significant learning difficulties they all make fantastic progress, but are not expected to reach the levels of their mainstream peers. Nevertheless they are still counted in our marks and thus our league table position. This year these children accounted for about 8% of the year group, so the best score at level 4 or better (Level 4+) we could realistically aim for was 92%. Level 5 is what our more able pupils should achieve and Level 6 for the most able. A Level 6 is equivalent to a grade D at GCSE which shows how impressive their results are.

I am providing the results for the past three years to give you a fuller picture of how the school is performing in these tests.
